Paper Penguin Mask (Antarctica Activity)

Audience:

Primary school and younger children with help

You will need the following:

- White paper
- Black card
- Orange card
- Glue
- Elastic, string or a paper straw/popsicle stick etc.
- Scissors
- Copies of the template (card would be best)

Session length:

25-30 minutes

Preparation:


Make some cardboard templates and a sample of the masks.









Mask 1 - Use a plate, bowl or the round template to trace around on the black card and cut out.



Mask 1 - Cut out approximately a quarter of the circle for the mouth and nose (see template).




Mask 1 - Trace around the eye template (or draw your own) on the white paper and cut out including eyes. Younger children may need some help to cut out the eyes.



Mask 1 - Place your white cut-out on the black card and trace the eyes cut-outs. Cut out the eyes from the black card.







Mask 1 - Draw a diamond (or use the mask 2 beak template) onto the orange card and cut out. Fold in half to make a beak.



Mask 1 - Assemble your mask! Glue the white cut-out and the orange beak onto the black card.




Mask 2 - Very similar to Mask 1! Use the black mask template (or draw your own) to trace on to the black card and cut out including eyes. Younger children may need some help to cut out the eyes.



Mask 2 - Trace around the white eye template (or draw your own) on the white paper and cut out including eyes.





Mask 2 - Trace the diamond/beak template (or draw your own) onto the orange card and cut out.



Mask 2 - Assemble your mask! Glue the white cut-out and the orange beak onto the black card.




For both masks add a popsicle stick/paper straw to one side to hold up to face.



Or use string or elastic to keep on your face. Staple on or punch a hole to tie. Tip - if you put tape over the where you punch the hole first, it makes it stronger.
