

Matariki is the Mother of the Kāhui - cluster. She is associated with health and wellbeing of people. She also is a sign of hope, reflection, our connection to the environment and people gathering.



Pohutukawa

She is associated with those who have passed on.





Tupuānuku

She is associated with things that grow in the soil that are harvested or gathered



He is associated with food that grows in trees and bushes, like fruit and also birds.







She is associated with fresh water groups like lakes, rivers and streams and all the food sources in them.









He is associated with the ocean and the food sources within.

Waipunarangi/Waipunārangi

She is associated with the rain.
